Young Arts



In 2002, the committee of ADFAS Gold Coast decided to provide a scholarship to enable young people to appreciate and enjoy the arts. Jeanene Hyles was asked to facilitate this.

The first fund-raising function organized was a tour of an exhibition at the Gold Coast City Art Gallery followed by a light lunch. There were sixteen participants. Each year this number has increased as has the money raised.

In 2005, Jacqui Stephens took over the position on the committee and was followed by Lynne Rau. Lynne organized an evening lecture "The Art of Collecting" presented by Lachlan Henderson of Phillip Bacon Galleries and it was hugely successful.

Sufficient funds had now been raised to begin the Pamela Rainger Memorial Travel Stipend with a prize of \$1,000. Young artists aged between eighteen to twenty-five years were eligible..

To help us, we asked the Gold Coast City Art Gallery to assist with the choice and they suggested the artist be chosen from the participants in the Border Art Prize Competition. At that stage the winner was asked to report to ADFAS on the inspiration found after their visits to the galleries and the exhibitions of their choice.

This was later expanded when artists were asked to write fifty words on their reason for entering the competition.

Since then the excellent Young Arts Convenors have included Dianne Cecil, Judy Bewicke, Carol Croad and Moreena Hull and it has proved a successful way to promote and inspire the young enthusiast.

The Pamela Rainger Study Stipend.

The final recipient of the Pamela Rainger Study Stipend of \$1,100 wih \$100 donated by Musgrave Arts was Daniel Hen in 2015. Unfortunately, due to limited Gallery space availability, with the management and planning for the opening of the new HOTA Gallery and more recently with Covid 19 Border restrictions, the Border Art Prize and the awarding of the Pamela Rainger Study stipend as a joint venture between ADFAS Gold Coast and Musgrave Arts was suspended in 2017.

Youth Theatre.

Commencing in 2013 ADFAS donated \$1,000 towards the Arts Centre Youth Theatre Project. In 2014, the amount donated increased to \$2,000. In 2015, in addition to supporting the Youth Theatre Project for a total of \$2,000, ADFAS also supported a Theatre Project whereby young disabled students worked with able students. ADFAS donated \$1,000 towards this project which meant that ADFAS donated a total of \$3,000 to Youth Theatre. This level of support was maintained for 2016, 2017 and 2018. In 2019 \$2,000 donated.

Gold Coast Youth Orchestra.

ADFAS Gold Coast has funded Gold Coast Youth Orchestra since 2013. In 2013, ADFAS donated \$2,000 towards the purchase of a snare drum. In 2014, \$4,000 was donated to the refurbishment and retuning of a baby grand piano donated by Ann Dean. Each year until 2019, ADFAS has donated monies to the Gold Coast Youth Orchestra.



Junior d'Arcy Doyle Award. ADFAS Gold Coast funded this Award from 2011 until 2017.




Voices in Paradise.

From 2015-2019 ADFAS donated \$1,000 per year to Voices in Paradise to fund the annual youth workshop with training provided by internationally renowned a capella singers and educators in partnership with Griffith University. Most participants are from Gold coast Secondary Schools.



Art Lab is a making and learning programme developed for under 5's to teenagers. ADFAS donated \$2,000 in 2019 and \$1,000 in 2020 to enable local artists to lead children and young people in classes, workshops and events to support children in interpreting and connecting to the content of Exhibitions and the Collection. In 2021, ADFAS donated \$2,000 to the operation of the HOTA Children's Gallery.



In 2021, ADFAS donated \$1,000 to support the programme of the Queensland Ballet Academy in providing specialist training in Ballet and Contemporary Dance for children and young people with skills and talents in dance.





ADFAS Gold Coast OCA Honours Award.

A donation of \$1,000 to top up the interest earned from our \$23,000 Endowment to the Queensland College of Arts (Griffith University) for the purpose of establishing the ADFAS Gold Coast QCA Honours Award and enabling the successful awardee to receive a stipend of \$2,000, has been paid each year from 2014 to the present.



The inaugural Awardee in 2014 was Chris Miller whose area of research was 3D Design. Using 3-D printing, Chris designed a flexible structure for the production of body braces for the treatment of spinal injuries. Chris has subsequently attained international recognition in the field of 3D Design. He was presented with his Award in November 2013 by Ann Dean, then Chairman, ADFAS Gold Coast. He presented the outcome of his research in December, 2014 at the ADFAS AGM and Cocktail Party.





The second ADFAS Gold Coast QCA Honours Awardee for 2015 was Monique Montfroy - a documentary photographer.
